## QUALIFICATION SYSTEM

## GENERAL PRINCIPLES

2. Only athletes who have attained the minimum qualification scores can be entered in one or more events on the Olympic shooting program. Minimum qualification scores can only be obtained at UIT World Championships, at the Continental Championships and in UIT designated Qualification Competitions (UTT World Cups Art. 9). MQS and quota places, Art. 4., are awarded during the 4 (four) years between the Olympic Games.
