Av Svenska Friidrottsförbundet (SFIF) kompl. uttagningsregler:

• Uttagning sker av SOK.

- Aktiva som av SOK placerats i SOKs toppgrupp för 2000, kommer automatiskt att bli uttagna den 1999-11-29.
- SFIF nominerar vid tre tillfällen: 1999-11-29, 2000-02-29, 2000-06-04 (endast marathon), 2000-07-18 och 2000-08-08. Det senaste datumet gäller i undantagsfall, den huvudsakliga nomineringen sker den 18 juli.
- SFIFs nomineringsgränser (som i många fall alltså är betydligt hårdare än IAAFs A-gräns!) skall uppnås vid minst ett tillfälle under tiden 2000-05-15 - 2000-08-07.
- För 10.000m gäller tiden 2000-04-01 - 2000-08-07.
- Marathon 1999-08-01 - 2000-06-03.
- Mångkamp 1999-08-01 - 2000-08-07.
- Förbundskaptenerna har, i undantagsfall, möjlighet att till SOK nominera aktiva som, under den aktuella nomineringsperioden, vid upprepade tillfällen varit nära nomineringsgränserna och som, i slutet av perioden, visar stigande formkurva.

A total quota of 225 riders and horses are qualified to participate at the 2000 Olympic Games and 266 horses will be allowed to enter the Olympic Stables as follows:

- **Jumping:** 79 Riders and 79 Horses with the addition of 16 (or 32) reserve horses. A maximum of 4 riders per NF are allowed to participate in the Olympic competitions.
- **Dressage:** 50 Riders and 50 Horses with the addition of 10 reserve horses. A maximum of 4 riders per NF are allowed to enter the Olympic competitions.
- **Three Day Event:** 96 Riders and 96 Horses with the addition of 15 reserve horses. A maximum of 7 riders per NF are allowed to enter the Olympic competitions.

GENERAL PRINCIPLES

2. Only athletes who have attained the minimum qualification scores can be entered in one or more events on the Olympic shooting program. Minimum qualification scores can only be obtained at UIT World Championships, at the Continental Championships and in UIT designated Qualification Competitions (UIT World Cups Art. 9). MQS and quota places, Art. 4., are awarded during the 4 (four) years between the Olympic Games.
